CONTINUING EDUCATION INFORMATION

Physicians:

Social Workers:

This program was approved by the National Association of Social Workers – Tennessee Chapter (Provider Number: NASWTN2025-0108) for up to 12 continuing education units. Professionals in attendance at this conference are encouraged to review Chapter 1365-1 to ensure the workshop they are attending is applicable and appropriate to their professional development. Psychologists:

As stated within the rules of the Tennessee Board of Examiners in Psychology - Psychologists, Senior Psychological Examiners, and Psychological Examiners are required to obtain forty (40) hours of continuing education (CE) credit every two (2) years. This CE shall be acquired in the two (2) calendar years (January 1 - December 31) prior to the licensure renewal year. A minimum of twenty (20) of these hours must involve the opportunity for real time interaction during the event. At least nine (9) of the forty (40) hours must consist of continuing education provided by an APA approved sponsor. Per Rule 1180-01-08 Other Sponsor Approved Continuing Education - These are formal activities which are psychological in nature, provide documentation of attendance, and have a pre-assigned number of CE credits. Offerings can be sponsored by a regional psychological association, a state psychological association, a recognized and relevant national, regional or state professional credentialing body. CE Certificates will be provided by NASW-TN to Psychologists

Licensed Professional Counselors, Licensed Marriage and Family Therapists & Other Professionals Not Listed:

Attendance at educational events sponsored by national, state, regional, or local professional associations in the field; or events related to the practice of the profession for which a nationally or regionally accredited institution of higher education grants CEUs. Each person must retain proof of attendance and completion of all CE requirements. This documentation must be retained for a period of four (4) years from the end of the calendar year in which the CE was acquired. CE Certificates will be provided by NASW-TN to Licensed Professional Counselors, Licensed Marriage and Family Therapists & Other Professionals not listed.


